Imphal, the 6th January, 1982**

No. 1/22/79(Rules)/DP.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India, the Governor of Manipur hereby makes the following Rules, namely:—

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) These Rules may be called the Manipur Health Service Rules, 1982.

(2) They shall come into force with immediate effect.

2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

(a) 'Basic Medical or Public Health Qualifications' means the recognised medical qualifications specified in any of the schedules to Indian Medical Council Act, 1956;

(b) 'Commission' means the Manipur Public Service Commission;

(c) 'Controlling Authority' means the Government of Manipur in the Medical Department;

(d) 'Category' means any of the categories of posts included in various Grades in Schedule-I;

(e) 'Duty Post' means any post included in Schedule-I;

(f) 'Government' means the Government of Manipur;

(g) 'Governor' means the Governor of Manipur;

(h) 'Grade' means any of the grades specified in column 2 of the Table under Rule 4;

(i) 'Medical Officer' means an officer appointed or deemed to have been appointed under the provisions of the rules;

(j) 'Schedule' means a schedule appended to these rules;

(k) 'Schedule Caste & Schedule Tribes' have the same meaning as in clauses (24) and (25) of Article 366 of the Constitution;

(l) 'Service' with a capital 'S' means the Manipur Health Service constituted under Rule 3.

3. Constitution of the Service.—There shall be constituted a service known as the Manipur Health Service. The Service shall consist of—

(a) persons appointed to the service under Rule 6, and

(b) persons appointed to the service under Rule 7.

4. Classification, Grade & Scale of pay.—(i) There shall be five grades in the Service with respective scales of pay and classification as specified in the following table:—

(i) (A) The scale of pay for various grades shown above is subject to revision from time to time at the discretion of the Government.

(i) (B) Members of the Central Health Service now on deputation to Manipur shall be allowed to retain the present C.H.S. scales of pay as personal to them till they vacate the posts they are holding. They will not be entitled to any further revision of pay scales of C.H.S. If, however, the State Government revise the scales of other Departments of the State Government, their cases may be considered along with those cases.

(i) (C) All new incumbents and non-Central Health Service officials shall be deemed to be in the scales laid down in Rule 4(i) above. Higher pay or higher scale of pay they get in ad hoc capacity, if any, will not entitle them to claim that higher pay or higher scale of pay when appointed in the Service.

(ii) **Non-practising allowance.**—Persons appointed to the Service shall not be allowed private practice of any kind whatsoever, not excluding consultancy and laboratory practice. They shall, however, be entitled to a non-practising allowance at the rates indicated below:—

Pay :	Rate of Non-practising Allowance :
Upto Rs. 860/-	Rs. 150/- per month.

(ii) (A) The rate of non-practising allowance shown above is subject to revision from time to time at the discretion of the Government.

5. Authorised strength of the Service.—(1) The authorised strength of the Service is classified into two parts—Permanent posts and temporary addition to the Cadre strength as specified in Schedule-I. The temporary posts which are in existence for at least five years shall be added to the permanent strength from time to time. For this purpose, among others, the strength of the cadre shall be revised every five years.

(2) The Government may include in the Service any category of post other than the categories included in Schedule-I or exclude from the Service any category of posts included in Schedule-I.

6. Initial appointment to the Service.—(1) The existing members of the Central Health Service who are on deputation to serve under the Government of Manipur and also the existing members of the State Medical Department appointed in consultation with the Commission to ~~any post shown in Schedule-I~~ shall be absorbed on the commencement of these rules against such duty posts as may be considered suitable according to their qualifications and experience as may be decided by the Selection Committee as constituted under Rule 8 (eight).

(2) The members of the Central Health Service and other officers mentioned in sub-rule (1) above shall be required to exercise their option to be absorbed in the Service, within 60 days from the date on which these rules come into force. The form for the exercise of option by members of the Central Health Service shall be as in Schedule-III and for other officers with such suitable modification as the Government may specify.

Provided that the Government, in special cases, extend the period of option upto ninety days.

(3) The absorption of the members of the Central Health Service in the Service shall be subject to the concurrence of the Government of India. In the case of any other officer who has a lien on the Government of India or on any State Government his absorption in the Service shall be subject to the concurrence of that Government.

(4) On the completion of the processes of exercise of option and concurrence of the Government of India or State Government concerned, as the case may be, the members of the Central Health Service and other officers mentioned in sub-rule (1) shall be deemed to have been appointed to the Service at its initial constitution. The appointment will be substantive or officiating or both to the various grades according to the nature of the appointment in the corresponding grade in the Central Health Service or, as the case may be, to the post under the Government.

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7. Method of recruitment.—(1) (a) Direct recruitment to any grade of the Service including specialist posts in a grade shall be made on the recommendation of the Commission.

(b) The qualifications for direct recruitment to the various Grades of the Service shall be as specified in Schedule-II.

(c) The Commission shall, after following such procedure for selection of candidates as they deem fit, forward to the Government a list, in order of merit, of the candidates who have qualified by such standard as the Commission may determine for selection in respect of the actual number of vacancies reported from time to time by Government.

Provided that the Commission may maintain a confidential reserve list for nomination of candidates for vacancies that may arise during the course of twelve months from the date of selection.

Provided further that if the Commission do not expect better candidates to be available outside the reserve list, it shall be open to the Commission to nominate candidates from the reserve list for vacancies arising during a further period of six months.

Explanation.—The period of twelve months or eighteen months, as the case may be, shall be reckoned from the date on which the original select list is prepared by the Commission upto and inclusive of the date on which the Commission nominate a person from the reserve list.

(d) On receipt of the recommendation of the Commission, the Governor may satisfy himself after such enquiry as may be deemed necessary and after such examination of physical fitness including medical examination as may be specified by Government that a candidate is suitable in all respects for appointment. Mere inclusion in the recommended list confers no right of appointment.

(2) Recruitment to the duty posts of the Service after commencement of these rules shall be made by the following methods—

(a) Promotion from one Grade to another and from the post of ADHS to DHS in the Service, shall be made on the recommendation of the Selection Committee, subject to consultation with the Commission except where the Commission is not required to be consulted under the Manipur Public Service Commission (Exemption from Consultation) Regulations, 1972.

Provided that the Commission shall be consulted in all cases where the Chairman of the Selection Committee so suggests.

(b) The Selection Committee shall forward to the Government a list of candidates, in order of merit, of the officers recommended for promotion, taking into account the actual number of vacancies and vacancies likely to arise during the next twelve months. The list shall be valid until the next selection for the same grade or specified post takes place or a period of twelve months lapses from the date of selection, whichever is earlier.

Provided that the aforesaid period of twelve months may be extended by Government (on consultation with the Commission) for a further period not exceeding six months.

Provided further that, in respect of a person against whom disciplinary proceedings under the Central Civil Services (Classification, Control & Appeal) Rules, as adopted in Manipur are in progress, the recommendation of the Commission shall be kept with the Chairman of the Committee in a sealed cover to be opened at the conclusion of the proceedings and such person shall not be appointed until he is exonerated from the charges as a result of the proceedings.

(c) The qualifications for promotion shall be as specified in sub-rule (3) below.

(d) The selection for inclusion in the list shall be based on merit and suitability in all respects for appointment to the grade or as the case may be, to the specialist post in the grade, with due regard to seniority.

(e) The Selection Committee shall, ordinarily, assess suitability on the basis of records of performance of the officers.

Provided that it shall be open to the Selection Committee to interview the officers and to give such weightage as they deem fit for the performance at the interview.

Provided further that if interviews are held it shall be open to the Selection Committee to require experts to assist it or to co-opt experts.

(3) (a) Every vacancy in Grade V shall be filled by direct recruitment.

(b) Every vacancy in Grade IV other than Junior Specialist post shall be filled by promotion from amongst officers of Medical Officer Grade V who have rendered 5 years regular service in that Grade. 50% of the Specialist posts in Grade IV shall be filled by direct recruitment. The remaining 50% shall be filled by promotion from Grade V who possess requisite qualification for the post and who have rendered 3 years regular service in the grade.

(c) Posts in Grade III shall be filled by promotion from Grade IV who have rendered 4 years regular service in the Grade.

(d) Posts in Grade II other than Specialist posts shall be filled by promotion from Grade III who have rendered 7 years regular service. 75% of the Specialist post in Grade II shall be filled by promotion from Grade III who have rendered 5 years regular service in the grade and possess requisite qualification for the post. The remaining 25% shall be filled by direct recruitment.

Provided that, in so far as promotion to any Specialist post is concerned, only such officers as possess the qualification appropriate to the post from amongst the qualifications prescribed in Part 'A' or 'B' of Annexure to Schedule II shall be eligible.

(e) (i) The post of Additional Director of Medical and Health Services in Grade I shall be filled by promotion from amongst officers of Grade II, who have rendered 6 years regular service in that grade, and have 18 years standing in the profession and who possess any of the qualifications in Part 'A' or 'B' of Annexure to Schedule II.

(ii) The post of Director of Medical & Health Services shall be filled by promotion of the Additional Director of Medical & Health Services. The eligibility for promotion shall be 3 years regular service as an Additional Director of Medical and Health Services after appointment in accordance with the Recruitment Rules.

(f) (i) In respect of the Specialist posts in Grade II and/or the posts in Grade I, which are to be filled by promotion according to the pregoing provisions, if no officer is eligible on the date when the vacancy occurs and no one will be eligible for a period of twelve months from such date or if the Selection Committee does not consider any of the eligible officers as suitable, the post may be filled by deputation for a period not exceeding five years or by direct recruitment as the Government may determine in consultation with the Commission on each occasion.

(ii) The qualification for deputation shall be the same as for promotion.

Explanation.—1. Appropriate qualifications means with reference to a Specialist post concerned with a particular speciality the Post-graduate qualification in that speciality.

2. Period of service in a grade shall be construed so as to include service rendered after appointment on regular basis in accordance with the recruitment rules in the corresponding grade in the Central Health Service or, as the case may be, in the corresponding post under the Government.

(4) While considering eligibility for promotion in so far as the service rendered in a grade is concerned, notwithstanding any minimum period specified in any of the provisions in sub-rule (3), where any person is considered for promotion persons senior to him in that grade shall be considered.

8. Constitution of Selection Committee.—Recruitment of initial constitution and departmental promotion shall be made on the recommendation of a Selection Committee (hereinafter referred to as the Committee), consisting of:

- (i) Chairman: The Chairman or a Member of the Commission.
- (ii) Members: Secretary of the Department to which the cadre relates or any other Senior Secretary as decided by the Government.
- (iii) Director of Health Services or any other senior specialist nominated by the Government, either locally or from outside (for all Grades other than Grade I for which another Senior Secretary will be nominated by the Government).

9. Probation.—(1) All Officers appointed to various grades of the Service except in the case of those who are deemed to be permanent on the day on which these rules come into force, in so far as the grade in which they are so deemed to be permanent is concerned, shall be on probation for a period of two years from the date of such appointment.

Provided that the Governor may in consultation with the Commission, for the purpose of reckoning the said period of two years, count, officiating service in a grade, or other service in a post carrying equivalent or higher responsibility including service on deputation or foreign service.

(2) The Governor may, in consultation with the Commission, extend the said period of probation, in cases where the performance of the officer during the period of probation is not considered to be satisfactory.

(3) On the completion of the period of probation an officer shall, if considered fit for permanent appointment in consultation with the Commission, be confirmed, subject to availability of vacancies.

(4) If on the expiration of the period of probation referred to in sub-rule (1) or any extension thereof referred to in sub-rule (2), as the case may be, the Governor in consultation with the Commission is of opinion that a person is not fit for permanent appointment or, if at any time during such period of probation or extension, the Governor, in consultation with the Commission is of opinion that the person will not be fit for permanent appointment, on the expiration of such period of

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probation or extension, may discharge him or revert him to his substantive grade or post or pass such orders as he thinks fit.

(5) During the period of probation, an officer shall undergo such training as may be prescribed by the Government.

10. Seniority.—(1) Seniority will be reckoned with respect to each grade of the service.

(2) All persons appointed under Rule 6 shall be senior to all persons appointed under Rule 7.

(3) The seniority of officers so appointed under Rule 6 shall be regulated as follows—

(a) The inter-se-seniority of the officers who were members of the Central Health Service shall be maintained.

(b) The inter-se-seniority of other officers mentioned in sub-rule (1) of Rule 6 shall be maintained.

(c) Without prejudice to (a) & (b) above the seniority of the officers mentioned in (a) above in relation to the officers mentioned in (b) above in their respective grades shall be determined on the basis of the length of continuous service they had rendered on regular basis in the corresponding grade in the Central Health Service or, as the case may be, in the post under the Government after appointment, in accordance with the Recruitment Rules.

Provided that for the purpose of fixing seniority in the grade in which they are deemed to have been appointed substantively, the service rendered in an officiating capacity in any higher grade or post will also be included.

(4) The inter-se-seniority of persons appointed by direct recruitment under Rule 7 shall be regulated by the order of merit specified in the list of candidates recommended by the Commission.

Provided that all persons appointed on the basis of an earlier selection shall rank senior to all persons appointed on the basis of a subsequent selection.

(5) The inter-se-seniority of persons appointed by promotion under Rule 7 shall be regulated by the order of merit of officers recommended by the Selection Committee.

Provided that all persons appointed on the basis of an earlier select list shall rank senior to all persons appointed on the basis of a subsequent select list.

(6) The seniority of officers mentioned in sub-rule (4) above in relation to the officers mentioned in sub-rule (5) above shall be regulated in accordance with a roster based on the occurrence of vacancies which by these rules are to be filled by direct recruitment and by promotion respectively.

Provided that the roster shall start with a promotee or promotees.

Provided further that the persons appointed by direct recruitment in pursuance of Clause (f) of sub-rule (3) of Rule 7 shall have the same benefit of seniority as would have been available to the promotees if promotion had been made to the vacancies.

11. Selection for officiating appointment.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules if the exigencies of a service so require, a duty post for which a member of the Service is not available, may after consultation with the Commission, be filled on an officiating basis by the appointment of an officer belonging to a State or Central Health Service on deputation for such period or periods, ordinarily not exceeding three years.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, where appointment to a duty post is to be made purely as a local arrangement for a period not exceeding six months, such appointment may be made by the Governor from persons who would be available locally or from any outside sources.

Provided they are otherwise suitable in respect of age, qualification, experience, etc. prescribed for such posts.

12. Liability of Service.—A member of the Service may be required to serve anywhere within the State, as well as on deputation or foreign service in a post under the control of the Central Government, a State Government, any local authority, or any Central or State Government undertaking on such terms as are in force from time to time.

13. Pay.—(1) The time scale of pay admissible to an incumbent of a duty post shall be as specified in Col. 3 of the table under Rule 4 for the Grade in which that post has been included.

(2) When a person is appointed to a grade, or is promoted from one grade to another, his pay shall be fixed in accordance with the Fundamental Rules.

(3) Any person appointed to the Service under Rule 7 shall draw initial pay in the time scale of the grade to which he is appointed or at such stage as may be fixed under the Fundamental Rules, or under the special orders of the Government.

14. Regulations.—The State Government may, in consultation with the Commission make regulations, not inconsistent with these Rules, to provide for all matters for which provision is necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving effect to these Rules.

15. Other conditions of Service.—In regard to leave, pension and other conditions of service for which no provision is made in these Rules, a member of the Service shall be governed by the rules and orders applicable to other officers of the Government in a corresponding grade or class, as the case may be.

16. Relaxation.—The Governor may, in consultation with Commission, relax any provision of these Rules to such extent as may be necessary to ensure satisfactory working of these Rules or to remove any inequitable results.

Provided that the power shall not be exercised so as to relax essential qualifications prescribed for appointment by any of the methods specified in these rules (including promotion) or the provisions regarding pension and age of retirement.

17. Interpretation.—If any question arises relating to the interpretation of these Rules or the regulations made thereunder it shall be referred to the Governor whose decision shall be final.

18. Repeal and savings.—(i) All provisions of previous rules and orders in respect of matters covered by these rules which were in force immediately before the date of commencement of these rules are hereby repealed.

(ii) Notwithstanding such repeal any appointment made or order issued, action taken or anything whatsoever done under the rules and orders so repealed shall be deemed to have been made, issued, taken or done under the corresponding provisions of these Rules.

19. Transitional arrangement.—(i) Until persons are appointed to duty posts in accordance with the provisions of these rules, such posts may continue to be held by officers who were holding the posts at the commencement of these rules as if these rules had not come into force.

(ii) Sub-rule (1) above shall cease to have force at the expiry of two years from the date of commencement of these rules.

(i) Possession of a recognised medical qualification included in the First or Second Schedule or Part II of the Third Schedule (other than licentiate qualifications) to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956. Holders of educational qualifications included in Part II of the Third Schedule should fulfil the conditions stipulated in Sub-section (3) of Section 13 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.

(ii) Possession of the qualifications prescribed in Part A or B of Annexure to Schedule II.

(iii) 18 years standing in the medical profession.

(iv) Extensive practical and administrative experience in the field of medical relief/medical research, medical education or public Health organisation.

Explanation:

'Appropriate qualification' means with reference to a Specialist post concerned with a particular speciality the Post-graduate qualification in that speciality.

Provisions for relaxation applicable to all grades and Specialist posts.

Upper age limits specified above for recruitment to various grades are relaxable:

(i) in the case of Government servants to the extent of service rendered by them under the Government of Manipur.

(ii) in the case of members of Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes as required by statutory provisions or executive order of Government. Experience specified above for recruitment to various grades including Specialist posts is relaxable at the discretion of the Commission in case of candidates otherwise well qualified.

(2) These rules shall come into force with effect from the date of publication in the Manipur Gazette excepting the amendment to existing Rule 13-A under rule 2 of these rules which shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the academic session 2005-2006.

2. **Amendment of Rule 13-A :** For the existing Rule 13-A of the Manipur Health Service Rules, 1982 (hereinafter referred to as the said Rules), the following shall be substituted, namely :

“13-A Training— A person appointed to the service may be considered for sponsorship for undergoing Post Graduate Studies as the Government may decide from time to time, subject to the following conditions :

(i) Completion of minimum 2 (two) years continuous regular service.

Provided that if any person appointed to the service undergoes any training without sponsorship by the Government he shall be given leave without pay for the period of undergoing training which shall be treated as break in service.

Provided further that Government may relax the condition or requirement of 2 (two) years continuous regular service in case of pursuing Post Graduate Studies by members of MHS in disciplines where there is shortage of Specialists with prior concurrence of the Department of Personnel."

Note : (1) The period of training for the purpose of further studies shall normally be the period as laid down by the Medical Council of India or the Dental Council of India and such other relevant Councils for ISM, Homeopathy and Nature Cure of the Government of India.

3. Amendment of Schedule-I : For the existing Schedule-I to the said Rules, the Annexure to these Rules shall be substituted.

Sir,

I am directed to invite a reference to your letter No.7/12/2005-MPSC (DR) dated 20-10-2005 addressed to the Commissioner (Health), Government of Manipur with copy to this Department on the above subject and to furnish the clarification sought for therein as follows: -

- (i) The MHS Rules have not yet been amended in conformity with the revised grades except in respect of Specialist Grade. Accordingly, the rules for appointment to old grades II, III, IV & V are to be followed for appointment to the corresponding revised grades I, II, III & IV respectively.
- (ii) As per Schedule -II to the MHS Rules, the minimum experience required for direct recruitment to revised grade-I (Specialist post/Consultant) corresponding to old grade-II (Senior Specialist post) is "10(ten) years' standing in the Medical profession" while the minimum experience for direct recruitment to revised grade-III (Specialist post) is "3(three) years' experience in the Medical profession after registration as a medical graduate". Hence the words "after Post graduation" occurring in item (iii) of the essential qualifications prescribed for direct recruitment to revised grade-II (Senior Specialist post) corresponding to old grade-III (Specialist post) may be treated as redundant and the minimum experience required for direct recruitment to revised grade-II (Senior Specialist post) shall be 8(eight) years' experience in the medical profession.
- (iii) The quota for direct recruitment to new grade-III (Specialist post) corresponding old grade-IV (Specialist post) has been reduced from the original 50% to 25 % vide Rule 4 of the MHS (1st Amendment) Rules, 1983.

2. It is further proposed that in order to remove any deficiency in the MHS Rules relating to the direct recruitment to Specialist posts of MHS, a meeting may be convened by the Chairman, MPSC at the earliest in which Commissioner (Health) and Special Secretary (DP) could be invited.

No. 23/42/17-MISC/DP: Reference is invited to the communication from the Government of India, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions (Department of Personnel & Training) vide O.M. No. 20011/1/2012-Estt. (D) dated 4th March, 2014 whereby general principles for determining inter-se seniority of direct recruits and the promotees of various Central services/posts have been laid down.

2. Having due regard to the principles as laid down and the need to address the issues of inter-se seniority of officers in various organized services, the State Government decides to adopt the above referred O.M. no. 20011/1/2012-Estt. (D) dated 4th March, 2014 of the DoPT in respect of all services/posts under the State Government of Manipur. The existing Recruitment Rules of all services/posts under the State Government shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

3. All the criteria/pre-requisites as laid down in the aforesaid O.M. shall be taken into consideration for fixation of inter-se seniority for all the appointment (Direct recruits or the Promotees) made hereafter. Appointments/promotions made before the issue of this O.M. will not be covered by this O.M.

4. The Seniority already fixed as per existing rules followed earlier in the State prior to the issue of this O.M. may not be reopened.

5. This O.M. will come into effect from 01-01-2018 with a publication in the Gazette.

No.1/1/2023-Health/DP(RR) : In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India and other powers enabling him in this behalf, the Governor of Manipur is pleased to make the following rules further to amend the Manipur Health Service Rules, 1982, namely :-

1. **Short title and commencement :**

- 1) These rules may be called the Manipur Health Service (1st Amendment) Rules, 2023
- 2) These rules shall come into force from the date of notification in the State Gazette.

2. The existing Rule 7(3)(a) of the Manipur Health Service Rules, 1982 shall be amended by inserting the following Rule 7(3)(a)(ii) of MHS Rules, 1982 below rule 7(3)(a)(i) :-

Rule 7(3) (a)(ii) : MHS Grade-IV officers from allopathy and dental cadres shall be elevated to the level of Senior Medical Officer and Senior Dental Surgeon at the pay scale of MHS Grade-III on completion of 5(five) years regular service. The post shall be designated as Senior Medical Officer (Non Functional) and Senior Dental Surgeon (Non Functional) respectively. Upgradation under this rule shall be done on recommendation of a Committee consisting of the following:
