No. _____: In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and in supersession of the rules specified in Rule 30, the Governor of Manipur is pleased to make the following rules regulating recruitment, promotion and other service matters in respect of Engineering posts in the Engineering Departments of the Government of Manipur, namely:—

1. Short title and commencement

- (1) These rules may be called the Manipur Engineering Services Rules, 2026.
- (2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Application

- (1) These rules shall apply to all Engineering posts from the level of Assistant Engineer to Chief Engineer specified in Schedule-I.
- (2) These rules shall apply to the posts and grades specified in Schedule-II and Schedule-III, and to such other equivalent Engineering posts as may be notified by the Government from time to time.
- (3) Nothing in these rules shall be construed as constituting one common State-wide Engineering cadre or one common State-wide seniority list across Departments. Unless otherwise specifically provided, each Department shall continue to have its own separate cadre, sanctioned strength and seniority list.
- (4) Cadre control, posting and administrative control shall vest in the concerned Administrative Department, subject to these rules and such orders as may be issued by the Government from time to time.

3. Definitions

In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- (a) “Commission” means the Manipur Public Service Commission;
- (b) “Department” means a Department specified in Schedule-I;
- (c) “Departmental Promotion Committee” means the Committee constituted under Rule 22;
- (d) “Engineering post” means a post specified in Schedule-II or Schedule-III;

- (e) “equivalent Degree” means a qualification treated as equivalent to a Degree in the relevant Engineering discipline under Schedule-V;
- (f) “feeder grade” means the grade from which promotion is to be made to the next higher grade under these rules;
- (g) “Government” means the Government of Manipur;
- (h) “Junior Engineer” includes Section Officer Grade-I, Section Officer Grade-II or any equivalent Engineering subordinate post re-designated or treated as Junior Engineer under these rules;
- (i) “regular service” means service rendered after regular appointment to the grade in accordance with the prescribed procedure, and shall include any period during which an officer would have held the post but for being on leave or otherwise not being available for holding such post;
- (j) “relevant Engineering discipline” means the Engineering discipline relevant to the post, as specified in the relevant Schedule, recruitment requisition, advertisement or Government order;
- (k) “sanctioned post” means a post sanctioned by the competent authority and included in the sanctioned strength of the concerned Department;
- (l) “Schedule” means a Schedule appended to these rules;
- (m) “select list” means a list approved by the competent authority on the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee or the Commission, as the case may be;
- (n) “Service” means the Departmental Engineering Service or cadre of the concerned Department.

4. Constitution of Departmental Engineering Services

- (1) The Engineering posts specified in Schedule-II, in respect of each Department specified in Schedule-I, shall constitute the Departmental Engineering Service of the concerned Department.
- (2) Each Departmental Engineering Service shall be a separate service/cadre, unless otherwise specifically notified by the Government.
- (3) The grades, pay level, sanctioned strength and discipline-wise distribution of posts shall be as specified in Schedule-II, as may be amended from time to time.

5. Grade, strength and review

- (1) The grades, pay level and number of sanctioned posts in each grade shall be as specified in Schedule-II.
- (2) The Government may, from time to time, by order, make additions, reductions or alterations to the sanctioned strength of any grade.
- (3) No change in sanctioned strength, pay level or classification of any post shall be made except with the approval of the competent authority and, wherever required, in consultation with Finance Department and the Commission.

6. Members of Service

The following shall be members of the Departmental Engineering Service of the concerned Department:—

- (a) persons holding regular appointment to posts included in Schedule-II on the date of commencement of these rules;
- (b) persons appointed to such posts by direct recruitment, promotion, deputation/transfer or absorption in accordance with these rules;
- (c) persons whose services are regularized or absorbed against such posts by order of the Government in accordance with law.

7. Initial constitution and re-designation

All existing regular incumbents holding Engineering posts from Assistant Engineer to Chief Engineer in the Departments specified in Schedule-I shall, on commencement of these rules, be deemed to have been appointed to the corresponding grade under these rules.

8. General principles of recruitment

- (1) Recruitment to the posts covered by these rules shall be made by direct recruitment, promotion, deputation/transfer or any combination of these methods, as specified in Schedule-III and Schedule-IV.
- (2) The percentage of posts to be filled by direct recruitment, promotion or any other method shall be calculated with reference to the total sanctioned posts in the concerned grade and not with reference to vacancies arising from time to time.
- (3) Recruitment and promotion shall be made discipline-wise wherever the post requires a specific Engineering discipline.
- (4) Reservation for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Persons with Benchmark Disabilities, Ex-Servicemen and other categories shall be applicable as per orders issued by the Government from time to time.

10. Direct Recruitment to the grade of Assistant Engineer or equivalent post

- (1) Direct recruitment to the grade of Assistant Engineer/Assistant Surveyor of Works or equivalent post shall be made through the Commission.
- (2) Direct recruitment may be made through the Manipur Combined Competitive Examination for Direct Recruitment of Assistant Engineers Rules, 2006, as amended from time to time, or through such other examination/ selection procedure as may be prescribed by the Government in consultation with the Commission.
- (3) Unless otherwise specifically provided in Schedule-III, forty per cent (40%) of the sanctioned posts in the grade of Assistant Engineer/ Assistant Surveyor of Works or equivalent post shall be filled by direct recruitment.

(4) The educational qualification, age limit and other eligibility conditions for direct recruits shall be as specified in Schedule-III.

11. Promotion to the grade of Assistant Engineer or equivalent post

(1) Unless otherwise specifically provided in Schedule-IV, sixty per cent (60%) of the sanctioned posts in the grade of Assistant Engineer/ Assistant Surveyor of Works or equivalent post shall be filled by promotion by selection from the grade of Junior Engineer or equivalent feeder grade.

(2) The following minimum qualifying service shall apply for promotion to the grade of Assistant Engineer/Assistant Surveyor of Works or equivalent post:—

Sl. No.	Educational Qualification	Minimum qualifying service
1	Degree holders in the relevant Engineering discipline or holders of equivalent Degree	3 years of regular service in the feeder grade
2	Diploma holders in the relevant Engineering discipline	5 years of regular service in the feeder grade
3	Diploma holders who, while in service, acquire a Degree in the relevant Engineering discipline or equivalent Degree	3 years of regular service from the date of acquiring such qualification
4	Officers holding the feeder grade on regular basis who do not possess the educational qualification mentioned at Sl. No. 1, 2 or 3 above	15 years of regular service in the feeder grade with outstanding record of service

(3) Selection shall be made from a common eligibility list of all eligible officers in the feeder grade, subject to fulfilment of the applicable qualifying service and other eligibility conditions:

Provided that, irrespective of seniority in the cadre of Junior Engineer or equivalent post, promotion to the post of Assistant Engineer or equivalent post shall be considered in the order of the date of completion of the qualifying service prescribed for the respective category of officers:

Provided further that where two or more officers complete the prescribed qualifying service on the same date, their inter se seniority in the cadre of Junior Engineer or equivalent post shall be followed.

(4) No separate quota or sub-quota shall be maintained between Degree holders, equivalent Degree holders, Diploma holders and other eligible officers.

(5) The different minimum qualifying service prescribed for different categories of officers shall continue to apply.

12. Promotion to the grade of Executive Engineer or equivalent post

(1) Promotion to the grade of Executive Engineer/Surveyor of Works/Engineering Officer or equivalent post shall be made by selection from the grade of Assistant Engineer/Assistant Surveyor of Works or equivalent post.

(2) The following minimum qualifying service shall apply:—

Sl. No.	Educational Qualification	Minimum qualifying service
1	Degree holders in the relevant Engineering discipline or holders of equivalent Degree	6 years of regular service in the grade
2	Diploma holders in the relevant Engineering discipline	9 years of regular service in the grade
3	Diploma holders who, while in service, acquire a Degree in the relevant Engineering discipline or equivalent Degree	6 years of regular service from the date of acquiring such qualification or 7 years of regular service in the grade, whichever is shorter

(3) Selection shall be made from a common eligibility list of all eligible officers in the feeder grade, prepared according to seniority in the feeder grade, subject to fulfilment of the applicable qualifying service and other eligibility conditions.

(4) No separate quota or sub-quota shall be maintained between Degree holders, equivalent Degree holders and Diploma holders.

(5) The different minimum qualifying service prescribed for different categories of officers shall continue to apply.

13. Promotion to higher grades

Unless otherwise specifically provided in Schedule-IV, promotion to higher grades shall be made as follows:—

Sl. No.	Grade	Method of recruitment	Field of promotion and minimum qualifying service
1	Superintending Engineer or equivalent post	By promotion	Executive Engineer/Surveyor of Works/Engineering Officer or equivalent post possessing Degree in the relevant Engineering discipline or equivalent Degree with 6 years of regular service in the grade
2	Additional Chief Engineer or equivalent post	By promotion	Superintending Engineer or equivalent post with 5 years of regular service in the grade
3	Chief Engineer or equivalent post	By promotion	Additional Chief Engineer or equivalent post with 3 years of regular service in the grade

14. Date of eligibility for promotion

(1) For the purpose of promotion, the date of eligibility of an officer shall be the date on which the officer fulfils all prescribed eligibility conditions, including minimum qualifying service, educational qualification and other conditions prescribed under these rules.

(2) Where a select list is prepared for a particular vacancy year, eligibility shall be determined with reference to the 1st day of January of that vacancy year:

Provided that the Government may, by general or special order, specify any other uniform crucial date for determining eligibility.

(3) Where no vacancy year is specifically identified, eligibility shall be determined with reference to the 1st day of January of the year in which the Departmental Promotion Committee is held.

(4) In the case of an officer who acquires a Degree in the relevant Engineering discipline or equivalent Degree while in service, the date of acquiring such qualification shall be the date of declaration of result, or where the date of declaration of result is not ascertainable, the date of issue of the certificate/ provisional certificate by the competent authority.

(5) An officer shall not be included in the select list for a vacancy year unless he/she is eligible on the crucial date applicable to that vacancy year.

(6) The date on which an officer becomes eligible shall not, by itself, disturb the inter se seniority of officers in the feeder grade. Inter se consideration of eligible officers shall be based on seniority in the feeder grade, subject to fulfilment of eligibility conditions.

15. Consideration of seniors when juniors are considered

Where juniors who have completed their qualifying or eligibility service are being considered for promotion, their seniors shall also be considered, provided they are not short of the requisite qualifying or eligibility service by more than half of such qualifying or eligibility service or two years, whichever is less, and provided further that they fulfil all other prescribed eligibility conditions.

16. No “failing which” provision

No provision in these rules shall be read as permitting promotion from a lower or alternative grade merely on the ground that eligible officers are not available in the prescribed feeder grade.

17. Filling by deputation/transfer in exceptional cases

Where the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, and where eligible officers are not available for promotion, the Government may, for reasons to be recorded in writing and in consultation with the Commission wherever required, fill up the post by deputation/transfer for such period and on such terms as may be decided by the Government.

18. Equivalent Degree

- (1) For the purposes of these rules, the qualifications specified in Schedule-V shall be treated as Degree or equivalent Degree in the relevant Engineering discipline, subject to the conditions and limitations specified therein.
- (2) A qualification shall be treated as relevant to the post only if the Engineering discipline/specialization is relevant to the duties of the post concerned.
- (3) In case of doubt regarding equivalence or relevance of any qualification, the decision of the Government, in consultation with the concerned Administrative Department and such technical authority as may be considered appropriate, shall be final.

19. Probation

- (1) Every officer appointed to the Service either by direct recruitment or by promotion shall be on probation for a period of two years, unless otherwise provided in Schedule-III or Schedule-IV.
- (2) The period of probation may be extended by the competent authority in accordance with the orders issued by the Government from time to time.
- (3) On successful completion of probation, the officer shall be considered for confirmation in accordance with the rules/orders applicable from time to time.

20. Seniority

- (1) Seniority shall be maintained separately for each Department and each grade.
- (2) The seniority of officers included in the initial constitution of the Service shall be such as may be determined by the Government after taking into account the existing seniority, date of regular appointment, grade, pay level and other relevant factors.
- (3) The seniority of officers appointed after commencement of these rules shall be determined in accordance with the general instructions issued by the Government from time to time.
- (4) In the absence of any specific Government instruction, seniority shall be determined as follows:—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruits, according to the order of merit/ recommendation made by the Commission or recruiting authority;
 - (b) in the case of promotees, according to the order in the approved select list;
 - (c) in the case of appointment by deputation/transfer/absorption, from the date of regular appointment/absorption in the grade, subject to such conditions as may be specified by the Government;
 - (d) where direct recruits and promotees are appointed to the same grade against the quota prescribed under these rules, their inter se seniority shall be determined in accordance

with the quota/rotation principle or general instructions issued by the Government from time to time.

(5) No officer shall claim seniority in a grade from a date earlier than the date of regular appointment to that grade, unless specifically provided by Government order or by a court order.

21. Appointment and posting

(1) All appointments to the posts covered by these rules shall be made by the competent authority.

(2) Officers appointed under these rules shall be liable to serve anywhere in Manipur and in any office/project/field establishment of the concerned Department.

(3) Transfer from one Departmental Engineering Service to another Departmental Engineering Service shall not be made except by order of the Government and subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified, in consultation with the Department of Personnel.

22. Departmental Promotion Committee

(1) Selection for promotion shall be made on the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee.

(2) For promotion to the various grades of the Service, the Departmental Promotion Committee shall consist of:—

(3) The Head of Department or a technical officer of appropriate rank may be invited to assist the Departmental Promotion Committee, wherever considered necessary.

23. Consultation with Commission

The Commission shall be consulted in matters of recruitment and promotion wherever consultation is required under the Constitution of India, the Manipur Public Service Commission (Exemption from Consultation) Regulations, 1972, or any other rules/orders in force.

24. Disqualification

No person—

- (a) who has entered into or contracted a marriage with a person having a spouse living; or

(b) who, having a spouse living, has entered into or contracted a marriage with any person, shall be eligible for appointment to any post under these rules:

Provided that the Government may, if satisfied that such marriage is permissible under the personal law applicable to such person and the other party to the marriage, and that there are other grounds for so doing, exempt any person from the operation of this rule.

25. Reservation and concessions

Nothing in these rules shall affect reservations, relaxation in age limit and other concessions required to be provided for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Persons with Benchmark Disabilities, Ex-Servicemen and other categories of persons in accordance with the orders issued by the Government from time to time.

26. Other conditions of service

The conditions of service of members of the Service in respect of matters for which no specific provision has been made in these rules shall be governed by the rules, orders and instructions applicable to officers of equivalent rank under the Government of Manipur.

27. Power to relax

Where the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do, it may, by order and for reasons to be recorded in writing, and in consultation with the Commission wherever required, relax any provision of these rules with respect to any class or category of persons.

28. Power to remove difficulties

If any difficulty arises in giving effect to these rules, the Government may, by order, make such provisions not inconsistent with these rules as may appear to it to be necessary or expedient for removing the difficulty.

29. Interpretation

If any question arises relating to interpretation of these rules, the decision of the Government shall be final.

30. Repeal and saving

(1) On and from the commencement of these rules, the following rules shall stand repealed/superseded in respect of the Engineering posts covered by these rules:—

- (a) the Manipur Civil Engineering (Public Works Department) Service Rules, 2016, as amended from time to time;
- (b) the Manipur Electrical and Mechanical Engineering (Public Works Department) Service Rules, 2016, as amended from time to time;

- (c) all existing Recruitment Rules, Service Rules, orders or instructions governing recruitment, promotion and service matters in respect of Engineering posts from Assistant Engineer to Chief Engineer in the Departments specified in Schedule-I, to the extent such posts are covered by these rules.
- (2) Notwithstanding such repeal or supersession, anything done or any action taken under the rules, orders or instructions so repealed or superseded, including any appointment, promotion, confirmation, seniority list, recruitment process, Departmental Promotion Committee proceeding, recommendation or order issued before the commencement of these rules, shall be deemed to have been validly done or taken under the corresponding provisions of these rules.
- (3) Any pending recruitment, promotion or Departmental Promotion Committee proceeding may be continued under these rules, unless the Government, for reasons to be recorded in writing, directs otherwise.
- (4) The repeal or supersession of the existing rules shall not affect any right, liability, obligation, penalty, disciplinary proceeding, court case, seniority dispute or other proceeding already accrued, incurred or initiated before commencement of these rules.

Note:

- (1) Inclusion of a Department in this Schedule shall not, by itself, create a common inter-Department seniority list.
- (2) These rules shall apply only to Engineering posts borne on the regular establishment of the Departments/wings of the Government of Manipur specified above. They shall not apply to Engineering posts under Government companies, corporations, societies, boards, authorities, autonomous bodies or other bodies which have their own bye-laws, regulations or service rules governing the service conditions of their employees, unless these rules are expressly adopted by such body with the approval of the competent authority.
